## Winter 2009 Review

2009 was in part a repeat of season 2008 where SKAAC again finished 7<sup>th</sup> in Division One in the APSOC AAA winter competition. Despite this result it was pleasing to avoid relegation. The women's team finished in 12<sup>th</sup> position.

The participation rate was down on 2008, with 30 athletes competing in at least one event, compared to 44 in 2008 and 23 in 2007. There were four female athletes in 2009, compared to 11 in 2008 and just two in 2007. Of 30 athletes in 2009, 11 competed in only one or two events, compared to 18 of 44 in 2008.

Season's Highlights included:

- Mark De Luca.
- Mark De Luca winning the APSOC AAA Male Athlete of the Year award.
- Mark De Luca, fastest times at Brighton by the Sea (scratch), 8km Lodge (scratch), Westerfold Park's quarter marathon and Hare & Hounds,
- Mark De Luca, second fastest at the McPhail,
- Mark De Luca, third fastest at the Hooley, Geelong Relay and the Orchard.

SKAAC had a few athletes running in AV Cross Country events under the APS United banner.

As a committee we concentrated our efforts towards the premiership rounds and attempted to attract some of the better SKAAC athletes to these events. The additional focus on the Winter season was pleasing but in reality there was only limited success. The best team result was at the Alan Hooley Relay, Gembrook where SKAAC finished 3<sup>rd</sup>. We also had the quickest time by an individual, Ryan Matthews.

SKAAC acknowledge the great work of the APSOC committee in organizing the season and also the work that goes into organising each event.

## **Summer 2009/2010 Review**

Summer 2009/2010 was a mixed athletics season for the club with fantastic individual performances at major championships outshining team results.

The two open teams qualified for the Venue finals at Box Hill – a good effort considering a slow start to the season. Many athletes were unable to compete in the early rounds due to school commitments. We also had some key athletes injured during the season, particularly in the field events where vital points are available.

Division 3 were the Venue Premiers and Division 1 finished 2<sup>nd</sup>. This effort earned a spot in the Shield finals at Doncaster where the stronger competition resulted in 6<sup>th</sup> place for our Division 1 team and 4<sup>th</sup> place for our Division 3 team.

Individually, Steve Cain achieved a B qualifier for the Delhi Commonwealth Games. His remarkable season also included the Victorian and National Titles and a club record in the Decathlon. Alex Rowe posted a huge personal best in the 800m in 1.47.56 and also medalled in the Victorian Championships with a 2<sup>nd</sup> placing.

Timas Harik continued his rapid improvement reducing both his 800m and 1500m personal bests and winning a Victorian Title. Other outstanding performers included Dan Bailey (3<sup>rd</sup> in National Decathlon in Tasmania), Matt Bertacco, Scott Crowe, Anthony Aloisio and Regan Logan (5<sup>th</sup> in final of 1500m Victorian Title). All these athletes qualified for the National Titles which is a great achievement.

Thanks must go to all the coaches who give their time and expertise generously. Peter Kehoe has done a fine job with many of the athletes and all runners are welcome to attend his sessions at the college as advertised on the club website. It is also important to thank those who have helped and supported the club at the track including the bbq (most notably Joe DeLuca) and officiating.

It would be great to build on what was a solid year with more personal bests and premierships next season!
